Aim:

The school sees Collective Worship as an opportunity to deepen pupils' spiritual, moral and religious awareness of themselves. The school hopes to develop pupils' spirituality as well as to increase their understanding of the beliefs of others. Through Collective Worship we aim to foster a sense of family and of community, built on mutual respect. It should be an enriching, stimulating and educational experience for all the children and the staff.

Meeting Legal Requirements:

Most of the assemblies will be of a Christian nature; and will reflect the broad traditions of Christian belief. The other main religions of the world will also be celebrated. The school's Core Values of Enthusiasm, Determination, Cooperation, Respect and Compassion will underpin all assemblies.

All pupils will take part in a daily act of worship unless they are withdrawn by their parents in which case provision will be made for their supervision.

Implementation of Worship:

There is a daily act of worship for all pupils. Pupil will assemble in Upper and Lower School assembly or in class or year groups. There will be a short time for reflection.
