## **YEAR GROUP UPDATES**

### **Reception: Doves and Ducks**



This week we have been learning all about right and wrong. It was wrong for the giant to want to catch and eat Jack but it was also wrong for Jack to steal the giant's golden hen. Goldilocks should not have broken into the 3 bears' house and stolen their porridge or broken Little Bear's chair. The children were indignant about the 'naughtiness' of these wayward children (but still think that the giant is a big bad baddie!!). Next week we are using the story of The Elves and the Shoemaker to think about gratitude: when we should show gratitude, what we have to be grateful for and how we can show gratitude. It is a core belief for us at Caversham Primary School that all children are polite and well-mannered and that they understand that asking and receiving should be accompanied by a 'please' and 'thank you.' It brightens our day no end when children think to thank us for doing something kind and shows that they are beginning to understand that their actions and words have an effect on others.



In phonics this week we have learned /h/ and /b/ and the sight word 'I.' Next week we will learn /f/, /ff/ and /l/ and the sight word 'go.' It is very important that for their confidence and reading fluency, the children learn their sight words off by heart. The sight words for this term are:

### **I, the, no, go, to, into**

This week in maths we have been matching quantities and numerals and using the vocabulary 'equal' and 'the same.' Next week, we will be revisiting our subitising, and we will specifically be using positional language to describe dot patterns.

Please remember to send in your child's reading book every day. If we don't get the reading books back into school then we won't have enough books to swap so it is crucial that we always have them back on Tuesdays. We also read with your children at different points of the week so if you can keep the books in bookbags then they will always be to hand.

### **Year 1: Skylarks and Swallows**



Another busy week in Swallows and Skylarks this week. In English, we started our new book *Orion and the Dark* by Emma Yarlett. A lovely story about a little boy called Orion who is afraid of lots of things but especially the dark until one day, Dark visits him and



takes him on an adventure to all the dark places Orion was afraid of. Orion begins to realise that the dark is not quite so scary after all. We began the week with a grammar lesson in which we practised extending our sentences using the conjunction 'because'. This helped us with our prediction lesson on Tuesday when we talked about the front cover and justified what we thought the book would be about based on the front cover and first page. We then looked at all the things Orion is afraid of, from angry grannies to haircuts, and what he has done to try and overcome his fears. We then drew some pictures of the sorts of things we are

afraid of and wrote some sentences adding adjectives to the nouns and using the conjunction 'and'.

In Maths we carried on our unit on addition and subtraction within 10. We found a missing part using cubes and a numberline. We then began subtracting or taking away by crossing off the objects on the page. We used subtraction stories - First there were 8 birds in the tree, then 5 flew away, now there are 3 birds in the tree- to help us.

In Science we named and described other materials like water as well as objects that are made from glass, rock and brick. We looked at how objects are made from the different materials.

In Geography we located the school on an aerial photograph and by looking on Google Earth. We thought about how maps are made from an aerial or birds eye view and then drew our shoe and a water bottle from a birds eye view.

We have also squeezed in some song rehearsals for the play "Santa's on Strike!". The children are working really hard to perfect their dancing and singing skills. On that note, Skylarks need children sized aprons so if you have any at home at all, please send them in. A reminder also please about our PE lessons - hair must be tied back and earrings removed or taped up.

Our phonics this week were /y+oo/ sound spelt 'ew' as in news and the long /oo/ sound spelt 'ew' as in screw and the high frequency words 'looked' and 'called'.

## Year 2: Red Kites and Robins



It has been another very busy week in Year 2; our play rehearsals are in full swing as we race towards our Christmas performances of 'Santa's on Strike! Tickets for the performances were sent home last Friday, so please check your child's book bag and contact the school office if you have not received these.



During English, we have been thinking carefully about the language we use to ask questions and have thought of the questions we might like to ask the old man in our story text, 'The Tin Forest'. In addition, we have been orally rehearsing and writing a set of instructions about how to plant a seed.

This week we have started a new topic in Maths and have been learning about the features and properties of 2D and 3D shapes. The children are becoming more familiar with the mathematical vocabulary: vertices, sides, faces, edges and lines of symmetry, as well as using the different shape names.

In Design and Technology this term the children are exploring the concept of design criteria, product and product user. They have been investigating the strength and stability of different materials and how strength and stability can be improved by changing the shape of a structure and its thickness. Next week, Robins and Red Kites will be putting all they have learned into practice when they design and make a chair for a bear!

### Year 3: Alder and Ash



This week in year 3 we have started working on our three and four times tables. In English, we have written a diary entry and developed our understanding of expanded noun phrases. In Geography we have been comparing a current and historical map of Caversham in preparation for our walk. In Art, we used pastels to take rubbings of different surfaces so that we can use them to make our artwork next week. In science, we have been creating and measuring shadows and we continue to develop our dance and basketball skills in PE.



### Year 4: Beech and Birch



This week in Year 4 at Caversham Primary has been full of energy, creativity and problem-solving! In maths, we wrapped up our first multiplication and division unit, practising almost all the times-table facts, multiplying three numbers, tackling multi-step problems and developing our reasoning skills. In English, we continued our journey through *How to Train Your Dragon*, and today the children proudly published persuasive letters urging Hiccup's dad and the village elders to rethink their decision to banish the boys. Science has been particularly hands-on as we experimented with electrical circuits and worked through lots of trial-and-error challenges. In geography, we explored the stages of a river's journey and researched some of the longest rivers in both the UK and the world. Meanwhile, in PSHE, we celebrated differences and discussed practical anti-bullying strategies to help keep our school a safe and supportive place. Overall, it's been a fantastic week of learning and teamwork. From Alfie, Beech.



### Year 5: Hazel and Holly



This week, we've focused on improper fractions and mixed numbers in maths. In English, we have been reading *The Wizards of Once* and have been creating expanded noun phrases with prepositions. During geography, we have identified the Alps in an atlas and thought about its climate and biome. In French we've continued with the theme of school and learnt how to say different subjects. In PSHE, we learnt about bullying and how to stop it. In RE, we found out about Guru Hargobind and how he helped 52 men to leave prison by sewing 52 tassels on his robe! In indoor PE, we practised different rolls and in computing we created soundtracks based on different genres. On Tuesday, many of us went to the Hexagon and took part in the Junior Music Festival - we had soooo much fun singing beautiful songs!

## Year 6: Spruce and Sycamore



**Maths:** Maths this week has been a fun one for us Year Sixes. We have been learning how to multiply fractions by fractions, divide fractions by integers and divide fractions by fractions. Additionally, we all had a go at this year's Primary Maths Challenge. This challenge comprises of 25 questions and you had 45 minutes to complete it.



**Science:** In science, we have been creating our own animals and have been making up their adaptations and what they have adapted to. First we drew a picture of our made-up animal, then we labelled it describing if it had wings and if it was a predator or prey.

**Outdoor PE:** During Outdoor PE, we have been using a variety of different attacking skills to lose a defender in netball. This means to get rid of them by using different techniques.

**English:** During English, we have been writing and planning diary entries and letters from the book *The Arrival*. This book has no writing so we had to be inspired by the lovely illustrations that the author Shaun Tan drew for us.

**History:** This week, we have been learning about Alexander the Great and debating if he really is that 'great'. We got a worksheet that explained that we had to write what it was like from other people's point of view in that time period.

**Indoor PE:** When in Indoor PE, we have been doing beats to the count of 4 and turning them into a sequence in a group of 4-6. Every week, we work on making them better by adding more or trying to synchronise more.

**DT:** In DT we have been told to bring in our teddies to craft an amazing waistcoat for them! At the end of the term, we will be holding a cute fashion catwalk and letting our plushies try on their new clothes!

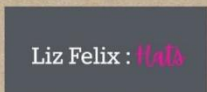
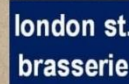
