ATTENDANCE:

We know that, especially during the winter, children can feel under the weather. We would like to remind all parents to refer to the NHS guidance 'Is my child too ill for school?'

It's fine to send your child to school with slight cough or common cold symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat or headache, as long as they're otherwise well and do not have a high temperature.

Children's learning can be really impacted by having 'odd days off' here and there over the school year because this disrupts a week's learning. We can think of these as 'broken weeks'. Good learning in school is reliant on building learning links, lesson by lesson and day by day. If one of these links is missed then the whole programme of learning can be disrupted, leaving children feeling confused and at risk of falling behind. In short, every lesson counts!

Thank you for your support in ensuring that your children attend school every day that they are well enough to do so.

SAFEGUARDING



Caversham Primary School is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has

experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

On 24 May 2024 Royal Assent was granted to The Victims and Prisoners Act. The Act placed Operation Encompass into Law.

This places a statutory obligation on police forces to share Operation Encompass notifications with schools/educational settings.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and through Operation Encompass we will be able to provide the best possible support to any of our children experiencing domestic abuse.

YEAR GROUP UPDATES

Reception: Doves and Ducks



Despite the rainy days, our learning hasn't missed a beat! Reception children have stayed busy, creative and curious to learn more - rain or shine! This week we have been continuing our learning all about 'under the sea'. Our book 'Above and Below' has allowed our children to learn all about different habitats and all the wonderful creatures that live there.



Next week we will be moving on to our topic: all about space! Our book next week will be 'Astro Girl' and our theme is all about working towards a goal. We have got some very exciting activities where the children will be focusing on how we work well as a team.

In phonics we will be revising all the sounds we have already learnt and will be learning two new sight words - her and they.

In maths next week we will be learning all about circles and triangles. We have lots of fun activities, such as, obstacle courses, treasure hunts and shape hunts to support our children's learning.

One positive to the wet weather is that we have been able to make use of our fabulous library bus which the children love. We have been taking small groups of children down to the bus for some reading sessions. It's so wonderful seeing such a love for reading already!

Year 1: Skylarks and Swallows



Swallows and Skylarks have worked very hard this week. We started the week with a spelling and grammar lesson on contractions where we learnt how to combine two words and replace the missing letters with apostrophe. We had fun finding these words by



looking closely in our class book Mole's Star. We then thought about how Mole felt when he realised that all the animals loved the stars as much as he did and that they were now all really sad because he had taken all the stars. How could he put this right? We pretended we were Mole and decided to write a letter to the other animals explaining how sorry we were. We generated ideas for this letter as a class and then we wrote these ideas in a letter. In maths we have been continuing to work with the numbers 10-20. We looked at these numbers on a number line and had fun looking for clues to help us fill in the missing numbers. We also compared numbers looking to see which number was greater or less than the other. In history we were inspired by the adventures of Nellie Bly. Nellie was born in 1864 and was famous for travelling around the world in 72 days. She travelled by ship, train, rickshaw and sedan chair and saw oceans, seas, mountains and cities. She even had a pet monkey! We learnt about the properties of materials in science. We brain stormed lots of different words as we passed objects around the circle such as hard, smooth, transparent and flexible.

The sounds we covered in phonics this week were 'ear' (pearl) and 'or' (world) which both make the 'er' sound. Also, 'eer' (deer) and 'ere' (here) which both make the 'ear' sound. Our high frequency words were 'many' and 'laughed'.

We are making rockets in computing next Thursday by following instructions we have completed on the computer. We need some large plastic bottles to do this. We be very grateful if you could send some into school for us to use. Many thanks.

Year 2: Red Kites and Robins



Robins and Red Kites worked so hard this week and the results were quite magnificent!

A huge well done to all for having such a positive attitude to learning and for showing lots of resilience when things don't go well at the first attempt!



In Maths, our learning about money continued with some lessons about calculating change – a dying art in the contactless world! – and then two-step problems.

Solving two-step problems is something that we need to become really good at in Year 2. Here's an example:

Toby buys some stickers for 45p and an apple for 35p.

He pays with a £1 coin.

How much change will Toby receive?



We talk a lot about the importance of identifying what operation is required for each step. In the example above, we need to first calculate the total cost of the items (addition) before then subtracting the total from £1 to find the difference – and the change. It takes practise!

In our English lessons, we started the week by finding out some details about Beatrix Potter's life. We read some information about her childhood, the books she wrote and how she spent her later years farming. Then we worked in groups to create fact files about her. Later in the week, we used our knowledge of events of *The Tale of Jemima Puddle-Duck* so far to write a diary entry in the role of Jemima.



Our Science lesson involved comparing seeds and bulbs. We looked carefully at examples of each and sketched some examples. In our discussions, we used phrases such as "bigger than" and "smaller than" to compare what we saw.

Year 3: Alder and Ash



This week in Year 3, we have completed our latest maths unit on multiplication and division. In English, we have been imitating the style of *The Velveteen Rabbit* in our writing. In PE we have been working on our country western dancing and handball skills. We are very excited to get started with our castle building in DT, any more toilet/kitchen/wrapping paper tubes and egg boxes are greatly appreciated! Also, next week we will be going on our trip. Year 4: Beech and Birch



This week in Year 4 we have been writing and performing internal monologues in English based on the book we have been reading. In maths, we have learning the bus shelter method for division and have also started our new topic of Length and measurements. In French we found out about different festivals like Easter and Christmas, and in PE we practised the inside and outside hook in football. In science we found out about microplastics and how they get into the food chain, and in computing we looked at a design programme called Microsoft Sway. In PSHE we played games to help us learn about team work and co-operation.

Year 5: Hazel and Holly



In Maths we have been finishing our unit on long multiplication and short division and solving problems.

In History we are learning about the Tudor monarchs and what their religion was.

In outdoor PE we are doing handball and learning about different passes and shooting to goal.

In PSHE we are talking about what jobs we might like to do.

In Computing we are learning about binary code.

In English we are doing *The Boy at the Back of the Class*. We've been learning about the main character Ahmet and refugees' journey to a safe home. We worked on using verb inflections in dialogue and when a character might use slang and contracted words.

In Science we are learning about the solar system and this week we've been measuring the shadow of a pole once every hour and then putting the data on a chart that shows the direction and height of the shadow. We discussed how it looked like the sun was changing position but actually the Earth is moving. The shadow was shorter around midday and we were very lucky to get some sun throughout the day.

In indoor PE we are doing gymnastics. This week we got into groups and created a sequence with canons and synchronisation using the equipment.

In RE we have been drawing Heaven using descriptions of Jannah from the Qu'ran.

In DT we learnt new techniques for our pop-up books.

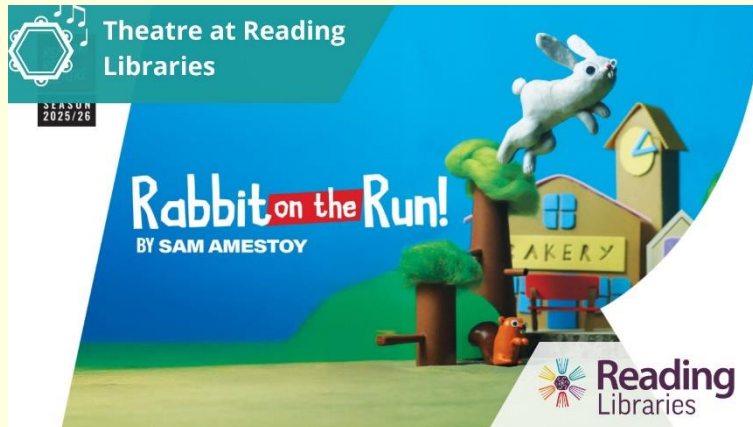

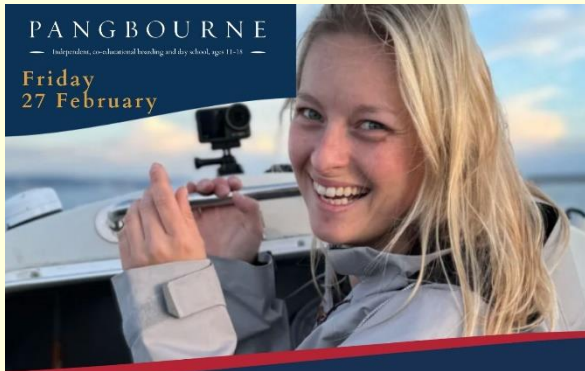

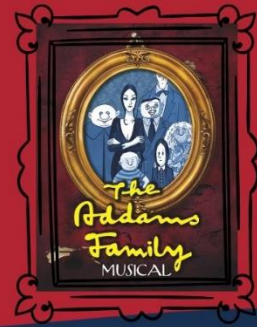
