We know that mornings can be a difficult time of day in busy households when there is so much to do and the clock is always ticking! Parents' Toolkit, part of BBC Bitesize, talked to a UK-wide panel of parents, to get their top tips on being ready for the school day/week ahead. How do parents stay organised? Do they have a morning routine? How can you keep your child motivated? They covered all this and more with their panel... There are some really helpful ideas from parents and experts around organisation, how to structure your morning, giving your child more responsibility, building a routine and helping to motivate your child for school

SAFEGUARDING

You will probably be aware through the media that misogyny is negatively impacting the lives of young people. Evidence tells us that half (49%) of secondary school teachers said they witness pupils making misogynistic comments or displaying misogynistic behaviours against other female pupils at least once a month or more - with 6% saying they witness this every day, and 21% saying at least once a week.

For primary school teachers, 18% said they witnessed pupils making misogynistic comments or displaying misogynistic behaviours at least once a month or more - with 1 in 10 (10%) reporting to witness this weekly. Tackling misogyny requires a united effort between schools and families. To do so we need to both confront sexism and misogyny when we see it and create environments which celebrate gender equality. So, what can this look like in primary education?

Primary Schools: Building respectful foundations

At this stage, children are forming their understanding of gender roles. The focus should be on nurturing empathy, fairness, and inclusivity for everyone.



Strategies in school include:

- Using inclusive language: Using 'everyone', 'children' or 'class' instead of gendered terms such as 'boys and girls'.

- Avoiding assumptions: not assuming interests or abilities based on gender (e.g. assuming boys like sports or girls like art)
- Ensuring diversity in classroom materials: Choosing books and resources that show girls as leaders and boys as caregivers and vice versa.
- Celebrating diversity: Highlighting stories and achievements of people in all genders in various roles and careers.
- Encouraging mixed-gender collaboration: Promoting teamwork and friendships across genders.
- Encouraging empathy and fairness: Using language that promotes kindness, cooperation and respect across all identities.
- Addressing sexist behaviour early: Using gentle correction and restorative conversations to help children understand the impact of their words.

You, as parents, play a crucial role in shaping children's values and beliefs. Home is where many gender norms are first learned - and can be unlearned.

Strategies for Parents:

- Modelling respectful relationships: Children learn from how adults treat each other. Show mutual respect and address sexist remarks.
- Talking openly about gender and fairness: Use everyday situations to discuss equality, stereotypes, and respectful behaviour.
- Diversifying media and role models: Choose a range of books, shows, and stories that include strong female characters and emotionally intelligent male figures.
- Encouraging all interests: Support children in exploring hobbies and careers regardless of gender norms.
- Challenging stereotypes gently: If your child says "girls can't do that" or "boys don't do that," ask questions that help them think critically and reconsider.



A united approach Tackling misogyny is a shared responsibility. By working together as school staff in the classroom and parents at home, we can raise young people who value equality, respect difference, and stand up against injustice.

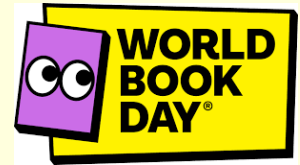

YEAR GROUP UPDATES

Reception: Doves and Ducks



This week has been really fun in Reception! With World Book Day yesterday and lots of beautiful sunshine, we have enjoyed plenty of outside time and even had PE outdoors. A huge wow for all the fantastic costumes based on your favourite stories! The children



looked amazing, and it was wonderful to see so many different characters come to life. We had a great time taking part in book quizzes, book hunts, and enjoyed special reading time alongside the Year 6 pupils. We were also incredibly proud of our children for reciting poems to an audience — well done to everyone for being so brave and confident!

This week in English, we spent time learning about Mary Anning, a very special British palaeontologist from the past. We explored her famous discoveries, the tools she used, and the special clothing she wore while searching for fossils. We also compared her work to that of scientists today and talked about how discoveries are made in the modern world. Next week, we will continue our non-fiction focus and begin learning about the history of the world. We will explore timelines, look at animals through time, and discover many exciting ways to understand how the world has changed.

In Maths this week, we have been learning about doubles to 10 (1 and 1; 2 and 2; 3 and 3; 4 and 4; 5 and 5). We have also been consolidating our learning about equal groups to make a double. To help us, we practised using the sentence stem: "10 is made up of 5 and 5." and the reverse: "5 and 5 make 10." Next week, we will use practical contexts to sort objects according to different criteria (size, shape, colour etc.). We will also continue practising recalling the composition of numbers as doubles — it will be a busy but very fun week of Maths! At home, please continue to practice: number formation; making equal groups; doubles to 10 and beyond.

Next week, the Scholastic Book Fair will be visiting the school. It will be open on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons, as well as Thursday morning before school. Please remember to bring your book voucher if you would like to use it. Thank you for your continued support, and we hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 1: Skylarks and Swallows



What an exciting week we have had in Year 1! In English we learnt about alliteration and thought of alliterative words for our own names. We then made up alliterative sentences for different animals - Pete the penguin put pineapple on his perfectly prepared



pizza. We then made our own Wild Things based on our class book *Where the Wild Things Are* by Maurice Sendak. We used collage to create them and used them not only in our English books but also for our door for World Book Day. We labelled our own Wild Things using adjectives and nouns (trying to remember our alliteration lesson on Monday!) and then wrote sentences using the conjunction 'and'. We also needed to remember our capital letters, full stops

and finger spaces. In Maths we finished our block on Place Value to 50. We had a practical lesson making numbers between 20 and 50 using dienes, ten frames, numicon and straws. We also used a numberline to 50 to work out where missing numbers were, estimated where numbers are on a "numberless" numberline and learnt one more and 1 less than numbers up to 50. In PSHE we discussed our bedtime routine and in Art we made tube towers with different coloured card. They look amazing. In Geography we identified seasonal changes in the UK and thought about all the words we could use to describe Spring and in RE we looked at the Creation Story and talked about why it is thought that God made humans last in the Jewish and Christian story. We identified differences between animal and human qualities. Finally, we had a fabulous day celebrating World Book Day. The costumes were wonderful, the wooden spoons so creative and we loved the Scavenger Hunt. We had the extra special treat of welcoming Year 5 into Year 1 to read with us and in Assembly we recited a poem we have been learning to KS1 and EYFS. It was a busy day but so much fun!

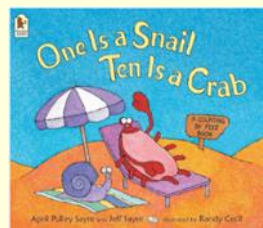
Year 2: Red Kites and Robins



It's been great fun in Robins and Red Kites this week! Each class practised a poem and performed it to an audience in Thursday's World Book Day assembly. It was fantastic to see the children recite their poems with such confidence and enthusiasm. During English, the children have had a go at writing their own poems too. They have used their senses to explore and extend their vocabulary.



In Maths, we have started our new topic about measure. The children have used rulers to measure and draw lines with increasing accuracy and precision. They have compared and ordered different lengths and heights and used the context of safari animals to realise just how long a metre really is!



World Book Day provided the opportunity to explore maths through story, so Robins and Red Kites used 'One is a Snail, Ten is a Crab' by April Pulley Sayre and Jeff Sayre. The story provided a great springboard for mathematical reasoning and problem solving. First, the children thought of a number and then they investigated how they could make this number using the number of legs from the animals in the story.

Year 3: Alder and Ash



This week in English, we have been writing diary entries from the perspectives of Mum and Dad from the story Zoo.

In Maths, we have been learning about fractions on a number line.

In Art, we have started planning our Egyptian scrolls by sketching Egyptian-inspired pictures that reflect ourselves.

Year 4: Beech and Birch



This week in English we have been reading 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe' and writing a diary extract as Lucy with expanded noun phrases. In Maths we have been adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers. In Geography, we have been looking at the layers of the rainforest and talking about the different species that live there. In



Computing, we have been looking at HTML coding and playing around with the codes to change a wanted poster. In Music, we have been looking at different clapping beats and using body percussion to create a layered piece. In Science, we have been looking at different types of teeth and seeing which ones we have in our mouth. For World Book Day we performed a poem that Alfie had written in the assembly and designed and created a Minecraft door, as well as playing reading games and doing a reading scavenger hunt outside in the sunshine!

Year 5: Hazel and Holly



In Year 5 this week, we've been working with decimals and converting them to/from fractions. We've been using thousandths. In English, we've continued to read The Jungle Book and have now met the characters Mowgli and Shere Khan. Most of us like Mowgli but a few are siding with the evil tiger. In Indoor PE, we've created routines about Mayan Gods, thinking about how relationships and dynamics show the god we're dancing about. In science, we dissected two different flowers to compare their



reproductive parts. In geography, we learnt about the Great Barrier Reef. Did you know between 2023-25 very hot temperatures caused the most damage to the coral reef than ever before? Yesterday was World Book Day. We did a scavenger hunt, shared our pop-up books with Year 1, created book-themed board games, performed a poem in assembly and, of course, read!
