YEAR GROUP UPDATES

Reception: Doves and Ducks



We have had another amazing week learning all about stranger danger and keeping safe in general. We have worked hard and sensitively to teach the children some strategies that they can use to keep themselves safe, including not going anywhere with



a stranger even if they say they have something really exciting to show you and not accepting gifts or treats from a stranger without your parents' permission. We have discussed what children should do if they get separated from their parents and we have identified lots of people that they might be able to trust to help them if they are in need. We have also encouraged the children to learn their first and last names and the first and last names of their parents - perhaps this is something you could help them with. If you have any questions about the lessons this week please do let us know and expect that you might get a few questions from your children.

Also this week we have been learning about Remembrance Day and the significance of poppies.

Our books this week have also supported us to look at and make some maps. We discussed what a bird's eye view is and we identified some features on a map. The children were particularly excited to find an elephant right outside Bristol! We then drew our own maps of the Gingerbread Man and Little Red Riding Hood's journeys through fairytale land.

Next week we will be thinking a lot about right and wrong and we will be supported in our learning by the story books Goldilocks and the Three Bears and Jack and the Beanstalk.

In phonics we have been learning the sounds 'u' and 'r' and the sight word 'to'. Next week we are going to be learning the sounds 'h' and 'b' and the sight word 'I'.

In Maths this week we have been learning all about composition. We have been focusing on the number 4 and exploring stampolines to deepen our understanding of number. Next week we are going to be looking at counting, ordinality and cardinality.

This week we have started reading our new reading books at school. We are so proud of all the children for how hard they are working at blending and segmenting words and exploring the story. Please keep practising reading at home with your children and please ensure that your child is bringing in their reading book everyday so we can continue to read with them at school.

Year 1: Skylarks and Swallows



This week we started to learn our songs and dances for the KS1 Christmas play 'Santa's on strike!' A letter will be coming home shortly letting you know what your child is in the play and how you can help by providing some of their costumes. We are very

grateful for this help, please let us know if there are any problems. Excitement is already building in Year 1!

Last week we read the fiction book 'The owl who was afraid of the dark'. This week we wrote questions about what we wanted to find out about real owls. We then watched some videos, looked at some non-fiction books and learnt some amazing facts about owls. We wrote these facts in sentences using the word 'and' to join ideas and make our sentences longer and more interesting. In maths we have been learning the different methods to add up- using cubes, drawing objects and jumping on a number line. The children are learning their number bonds of 10, they love the quick-fire game when one person says one number and the other says the other number to make 10. ie/ 6 and 4, 9 and 1. In science we looked at the materials wood, plastic and metal. We sorted objects by looking at what material they were made of and then thought of all the different properties of each material. In history we thought about why we have poppy day. We made a class poppy wreath and then joined in with the 2 minutes silence in the playground.

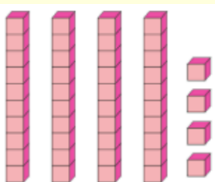
The phonic sounds covered this week were: ue making a y+oo sound in statue and ue making the long oo sound in blue. The high frequency words were Mr and Mrs.

Year 2: Red Kites and Robins



Robins and Red Kites classes have done so much great learning this week!

In Maths we concluded our unit of work on Addition and Subtraction. Over the past few weeks we've practised so many really important Year 2 skills and we will certainly revisit them throughout the year. Remember – it's so useful to know the number bonds to 10 and 20, to be able to count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s and to solve addition and subtraction problems with 2-digit numbers.



In English we spent some time learning about expanded noun phrases. We talked about how a noun is 'the name of a thing' if it's a common noun or the name of a person or place, for instance, if it's a proper noun that needs a capital letter.

Here an example of how we made our expanded noun phrases:



cat (*noun*)

the cat (*article + noun = noun phrase*)

the beautiful cat (*article + adjective + noun = expanded noun phrase*)

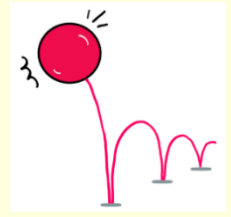

In our Science lesson we conducted a test to see which ball was the bounciest. We thought carefully about how to make sure our test was fair and decided it would be best to roll each ball from a table so that we could be certain they were falling from the same height each time. We made some predictions based on the materials that we knew the balls were made from and completed the test, using multilink cubes to build towers to indicate how high each ball had bounced. We had a lot of fun doing it!



Year 3: Alder and Ash



This week in Maths, we began our new unit on *Multiplication and Division*. We revisited our 2, 5, and 10 times tables and will soon start learning the 3, 4, and 8 times tables over the next few weeks.



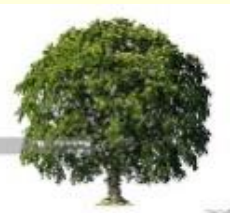
In English, we have been reading *The Bear and the Piano* by David Litchfield. Through role play, we explored the Bear's important decision—whether to stay in the forest or venture into the city.

In Computing, we continued developing our skills on *Scratch*. We learned how to tell a story by changing backgrounds, adding new characters, and incorporating speech.

During Indoor PE, we built on our machine-inspired dance sequences, using pushing, pulling, spinning, and turning techniques. We also focused on moving in *unison* for certain parts of the routine.

In Art this week, we learned how to shade using the correct shading grip. Using special HB pencils and following the four key rules of shading, everyone produced some fantastic shaded artwork!

Year 4: Beech and Birch



This week in year 4 we have been learning how to write speech in English and answering comprehension questions about the characters in *How to Train Your Dragon*. In maths we have been learning about the 7 and 11 times tables and their division facts. In PE we have been practising hitting a hockey puck to each other and in

science we made electrical circuits and made a bulb light up. In computing we programmed a maths game on Scratch and in geography we have looked at rivers and where they go.

Year 5: Hazel and Holly



In English we are reading an exciting book called The Wizards of Once. It's about a boy called Xar, who wants to catch a Witch and take her magic, and a girl called Wish who wants adventure.

In Science we are learning about different materials and their properties. We looked at different things and discussed their qualities and similarities.

In PE we are doing stretches and gymnastics in indoor PE and basket ball outside. In gymnastics we worked on partner balances and using equipment. In basketball we practised passing and dribbling the ball.

In Maths we have been doing Improper fractions. Improper fractions are when the numerator is bigger than the denominator. We converted improper fractions to mixed numbers and also looked at equivalent fractions and simplifying fractions.

We are learning about the Alps in Geography and had a refresher on continents, oceans and the different European countries. We then labelled the Alps on a map and found all the countries that they run through.

In Art we are talking more about installation art and planned our own small scale installation in a small box. We can bring in elements from home to create it the following week.

Year 6: Spruce and Sycamore



In English, we have been using noun phrases to describe pictures in our new book: The Arrival. In Maths, we have been subtract and adding fractions. As well as solving word problems that included fractions. In Science, we have been investigating mouldy bread for

over 3 weeks! In Outdoor PE, we have been learning the rules of netball and applying them to our mini matches. In Indoor PE, we have been making dances with groups of 4 and performing these to the rest of the class. In History, we have been learning about who the Ancient Greeks were and placed different key events on a timeline. In French, we have been learning about how to say different types of clothes and in RE we have been understanding the pros and cons of being a Hindu in the UK.

Message from the Wraparound Childcare Service at the local authority:

Dear Parent/Carer,

Over the past year, following the government's significant investment in childcare, we have successfully expanded the number of wraparound childcare places available across Reading. This expansion aims to make childcare more affordable, accessible, and flexible for all working families.

What is Wraparound Childcare?

Wraparound care refers to regular, consistent childcare provision for primary-aged children (typically 4–11 years old) before and after school—usually between 8am and 6pm during term time. This care may be delivered on school sites, at local community centres, nurseries, or by childminders.

This is different from out-of-school activities or school clubs, which are less frequent and often one-off sessions.

As your local authority, we are committed to ensuring sufficient and suitable childcare places are available to meet the needs of families. We are seeking your feedback to understand whether the increased availability of wraparound care has directly benefited your family, and to gather the most up-to-date information on parental demand in our area.

Your responses will help us assess current provision and identify opportunities to further strengthen and tailor wraparound childcare across Reading.
